

% of U.S. adults who get news ____ from ...



Restore LGDF to Intended Levels

Legislation has been introduced in Springfield to restore LGDF payments to local communities back to 10%. The legislation would:

Gradually restore LGDF payments to their 10% levels by 2025

Reporters Will Ask About Conveying Information

- On the record
- Off the record
- Not for attribution
- Deep background
- No comment



Create Key Messages

- Get all the facts
- Answer high-level questions
- Determine possible negatives
- Identify and develop primary focus points
- Identify supportive third parties
- Write a press release



Media Guidelines

- Initial off the record discussion I'll get more information
- It's important to you we take these allegations seriously
- Find out what they're looking for you want all the info you need
- Determine the messenger Mayor, Police Chief, Village Manager, etc.
- Written statement or Interview? less can be more



Avoid the pressure to give more

- Stick to your message
- Update responses w/ more info
- Think before answering
- Demonstrate passion




Message Delivery
