IV. Approval of Meeting Minutes – March 10, 2021

Motion to approve the minutes of March 10 was made by President Frazier. It was seconded by Mayor Dailly and unanimously approved.

V. President's Report – Kathleen O'Hara, NWMC President and President, Village of Lake Bluff

A. COVID-19/NWMC Here to Help Update

Mr. Fowler reported that Governor Pritzker announced on March 22 that all state and local employees were eligible for the Covid-19 vaccines. It was also announced that beginning April 12, all Illinois residents 16 or older would become eligible. Mr. Fowler stated that Governor Pritzker announced that the Bridge Phase between Phases 4 and 5 of the Restore Illinois Plan has been put on hold until health metrics started moving back in the right direction.

Mr. Fowler reviewed plans for vaccinating homebound residents for each county in the NWMC service territory. He said Lake County has a number that residents can call. DuPage County asks that people contact the county and they will do their best to vaccinate those individuals. Cook County residents can call the vaccine hotline to be placed on a waiting list. McHenry County planned on administering the Johnson & Johnson vaccine, so that effort has been put on hold with the pause on using the vaccine. He said that Kane County did not yet have information available for vaccinating homebound residents.

Finally, Mr. Fowler reported that he participated on a call with Senator Durbin regarding the American Rescue Plan and said that the U.S. Treasury is working on guidance for the use of funds. He said Senator Durbin cautioned officials that funds are to be spent in best interest of community.

B. Proposed FY2021-2022 NWMC Budget

Mr. Keller reported that the Executive Board and Finance Committee recommended approval of the proposed FY2021-2022 NWMC Budget. He reviewed details of the budget and reserve fund status and said that the Conference continues to remain in a positive financial condition. He said that for the eighth consecutive year, the proposed budget does not include a membership dues increase and congratulated the membership, finance committee and staff for the organization's financial stability. Motion to approve the recommendation was made by Mayor Rotering. It was seconded by Mayor McLeod and unanimously approved.

C. FY2021-2022 NWMC Officer Nominations

President O'Hara reported that the NWMC Nominating Committee met on March 23 and recommended the following individuals to serve as NWMC Officers for FY2021-2022.

A. Legislative Committee – Joan Frazier, President, Village of Northfield, Co-Chair and Nancy Rotering, Mayor, City of Highland Park, Co-Chair

1. Legislative Update

Mr. Bury reported that the March 26 committee deadline was extended to April 16 in the Senate and said both chambers face an April 23 deadline to advance bills to third reading. He said staff is monitoring legislation including further police reforms, lead service lines, small cell and HB171, which amends Tier 2 public safety pensions.

2. LGDF Working Group

Mr. Fowler reported on the Local Government Distributive Fund Working Group that consists of the regional councils of government and Metropolitan Mayors Caucus working to protect cuts to the LGDF and restore it to the historic 10% level. He said the DuPage Mayors and Managers Conference is administering the effort along with public relations support from Serafin and Associates.

B. Transportation Committee – Rodney Craig, President, Village of Hanover Park, Co-Chair and Tom Dailly, President, Village of Schaumburg, Co-Chair

Mr. Pasquini reported that based on input from membership, staff submitted a response to the Regional Transportation Authority's Recovery Strategy during their public comment period in

March. Mayor Craig commented on the importance of suburban transit and the need to continue to pursue support from legislators.
