C. RTA CPRG Grant Application Letter of Support (Attachment B)

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is currently accepting applications for Carbon Pollution Reduction Grants (CPRG) to fund strategies and measures from regional Priority Climate Action Plans (PCAP) that reduce regional carbon emissions. The Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) is requesting \$375 million from this grant for the Transforming Transit: Accelerating a Zero-Emission Fleet in the Chicago Region initiative. Specifically, this grant will implement the following goals from the region's PCAP:

1. Transition CTA and Pace's bus fleets to 100 percent electric by 2040 and;

2. Deploy electric trainsets while retiring Metra's oldest locomotives, which would reduce emissions in multiple NWMC member communities.

To supplement its application, RTA has requested a letter of support from the NWMC. Staff recommends support of the attached letter of support for the RTA's application. *Action Requested:* Approve recommendation
