E. MMC 2021 Climate Action Plan Resolution (Attachment B)

On July 13, the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus (MMC) officially launched the <u>2021 Climate</u> <u>Action Plan</u> (CAP) for the Chicago Region in partnership with the National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) and the Global Covenant of Mayors for Climate and Energy. The CAP identifies science-based goals and objectives for the region along with strategies for municipalities to take measurable and meaningful action to both dramatically reduce greenhouse gas emissions and develop resiliency to climate-related hazards that threaten the community, economic health and the natural environment. The MMC requests that each council of government adopt a resolution in support of the CAP and staff recommends approval of the attached resolution.

F. Proposed Lake Michigan Water Allocations

In July, the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) sent notice announcing draft demand forecasts/allocations to all permittees who draw water from Lake Michigan. The proposed allocations significantly reduce lake water available to permittees, potentially threatening economic development and planned growth in many communities. A number of NWMC members wrote letters to IDNR questioning the proposed allocations and requesting meetings to further discuss the proposal.

Staff has been working with the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus and our partner councils of government in the region to raise awareness and facilitate further discussions on the issue. To that end, Mayors Caucus Executive Director Dave Bennett sent invitations last week to NWMC mayors and managers announcing two webinars with IDNR Office of Water Resources staff to explain the issue and receive feedback. The webinars will be held on Wednesday, October 20 and Friday, October 22. The sessions will be held from 10:00 a.m. to noon and are identical, so no need to attend both.

G. Illinois Firefighter Pension Investment Fund Election Results (Attachment C)

The election for the two vacant spots on the Illinois Firefighter Pension Investment Fund was recently concluded. In the contested election (Schaumburg Village President Tom Dailly ran unopposed for the other seat), the fire protection district candidate defeated the municipal candidate. Of note is that 130 eligible voters did not turn in ballots. *Action Requested:* Informational

1. Status of Negotiations Between Metra and Union Pacific Railroad (Attachment E)

Metra sent the attached letter to all mayors and managers along Union Pacific (UP) rail lines assuring them of their commitment to continue providing uninterrupted service during ongoing contract negotiations with UP. In 2019, UP notified Metra of its desire to alter their Purchase Service Agreement, which allows UP to operate Metra-owned equipment along UP-owned tracks for a subsidy for commuter rail operations. Since then, a federal ruling has decided that UP does not have a "common carrier obligation" to operate commuter service. There are three UP lines within the Metra system, two of which run through several NWMC communities. *Action Requested:* Discussion

2. ADA Transition Plan Status

At their September meeting, the Transportation Committee received a presentation from the Metropolitan Planning Council (MPC) on the state of the region's Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Transition Plans (see "Where the sidewalk ends", which highlights existing plans in the region, including those from *Barrington, Bartlett, Des Plaines, Evanston, Hanover Park, Niles, Schaumburg* and *Wilmette,* for more information). CMAP is undertaking a multi-year effort to put additional resources into assisting communities in creating and implementing ADA Transition Plans and may base future programming decisions off of communities' ADA Transition Plan status and whether those elements are incorporated into project applications. *Action Requested:* Informational
