The North Shore Council of Mayors Technical Committee and the Northwest Council of Mayors Technical Committee met on January 18 and 19, respectively, and voted to release each council's draft FFY2025-2029 local Surface Transportation Program (STP-L) for a 30-day public comment period. 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#### Interested in RAISE-ing the Bar for Transportation Projects

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) recently released a <u>Circular Letter</u> announcing that the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) has released a <u>NOFO for the Rebuilding American</u> <u>Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity</u> (<u>RAISE</u>) <u>Grant Program</u>. This grant funds surface transportation projects that will have a significant local or regional impact that advance the USDOT priorities of safety, equity, climate, sustainability, workforce development, job quality and wealth creation.

Greenhouse gas reduction in the transportation sector and other environmental impact avoiding projects are encouraged.

USDOT has additional information, including information on how to apply, frequently asked questions, previously recorded webinars and tools to help identify historically disadvantaged communities or areas of persistent poverty on the <u>USDOT RAISE website</u>.

Interested agencies must apply through <u>Grants.gov</u> by Wednesday, February 28 at 10:59 p.m.

Cook County recently opened applications for the Department of Transportation and Highways (DOTH) Invest in Cook grant program, which aims to assist communities with transportation infrastructure improvements. These grants are available to local governments and agency partners to "prioritize transit and other transportation alternatives, support the region's role as North America's freight capital, promote equal access to opportunities, maintain and modernize existing infrastructure, and increase investments in transportation." # Applying for federal Transportation Grants? Check the USDOT Checklist!

The USDOT wants you to be putting your best foot forward for federal transportation grant funding. To do so, they have created a <u>Project Readiness Checklist</u>. From generalized background and guidance to planning, compliance or environmental requirements, the checklist can help you identify what your organization needs to accomplish to be at the top of the application list.

# US DOT Soliciting Project Applications for Bridge Investment Program

The USDOT is providing up to \$80 million in Planning Project grants and up to \$9.62 billion for Bridge Projects focused on safety and condition improvements of existing poor condition bridges. USDOT will accept applications for projects for FFY2023-2026. Applications can utilize templates, a cost-benefit tool, and find answers to questions at the Bridge Improvement Program (BIP) website. Due dates depend on the FFY and type of application submitted as follows:

Fiscal Year BIP Funding	Planning Application Deadline	Bridge Project Application Deadline
FY 2023 and 2024	February 19, 2024	March 19, 2024
FY 2025	October 1, 2024	November 1, 2024
FY 2026	October 1, 2025	November 1, 2025

#### Biden Administration Announces \$623 million in EV Charging Grants, \$15 million for Illinois

On January 11, <u>the Biden administration</u> <u>announced \$623 million in EV charging grants</u> <u>for 47 projects across the nation</u>. Funded by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law's Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Discretionary Grant Program, this competitive program plans to build out a "convenient, affordable, reliable and made-in-America national network of EV chargers."

The Illinois Finance Authority received \$15 million in grants for the State of Illinois Community Charging Program, which will help build out <u>IDOT's EV Charging Corridors</u> and suggested EV Charging. Stations <u>network</u>. Information on the funding process is forthcoming.
