## Barrington Breaks Ground on US 14 Grade Separation

On April 23, the *Village of Barrington* held a <u>groundbreaking ceremony for its U.S. Route</u> <u>14 Grade Separation project</u>. The project will feature an underpass beneath the Canadian National Railway tracks, allowing safer travel for drivers, cyclists, and pedestrians.

The village secured a federal grant in 2010 for the project's initial planning and in 2019 received funding from the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning's (CMAP) Surface Transportation Program Shared Fund as the top-scoring project application.

Excavation and grading for a temporary road will happen first, and by late summer, contractors plan to complete the temporary tracks and rail alignments. Following that, early stages of the underpass excavation will begin. The project is expected to be completed by July 2027.

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#### IDOT Announces FY 2027 HSIP Call for Projects

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) has announced the <u>FY 2027 Local</u> <u>Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP)</u> call for projects. IDOT plans to allocate \$32.75 million to local agencies to support projects that reduce traffic fatalities and serious injuries, aligning with the national "moving toward zero" initiative.

This funding opportunity prioritizes projects addressing High Risk Rural Roads (HRRR) and Vulnerable Road Users (VRU), with a focus on systemic improvements like signage, pavement markings, and guardrail upgrades. Eligible projects can receive up to 90% federal funding support, with local agencies responsible for the remaining 10% match.

Local public agencies must submit detailed project information, including crash data, cost estimates, timelines, and narratives. Resources such as crash analysis tools and sample applications are available on IDOT's HSIP website. IDOT encourages interested agencies to attend the informational webinar on Thursday, May 8, at 10:00 a.m., to learn application best practices. more about Applications are due by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, June 20.

## Final Reminder: IDNR Bicycle Path Grant Applications Due Next Week

Friday, May 9 at 5:00 p.m. is the deadline to apply for the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) Illinois Bicycle Path Grant Program. Grants can assist communities in acquiring and developing land for bicycle paths, including land acquisition, easements or leases, trail construction, path renovation, and support facilities. Grants of up to \$200,000 are available and require a 50% project cost match. To learn more, including how to apply, please visit the <u>Illinois Bicycle</u> Path Grant Program website.

#### Tap Into Those Unused Rebuild Illinois Funds!

IDOT has notified communities that remaining Rebuild Illinois (RBI) funds can be retroactively applied to projects and substitute out utilized motor fuel taxes (MFT) as far back as 2019. IDOT only requires a community wanting to utilize RBI funds for a project to adopt a supporting resolution by Tuesday, July 1. The League of American Bicyclists is currently accepting applications to become recognized as a Bicycle Friendly Community (BFC). The League provides a roadmap, hands-on assistance and recognition for communities seeking to build places more welcoming to NWMC who bike. member people communities with BFC status include Silverranked Evanston and Bronze-ranked Glenview, Highland Park, Schaumburg, and Wilmette. #### IDOT Hosting Conference on Special Programs

Assistance from IDOT Special Programs Unit staff will be available during a rotating two day informational conference to offer general information on the programs as well as answer specific questions, with a morning informational session on Day 1 and afternoon 30-minute one-on-one appointments to discuss specific projects and applications on Day 1 and Day 2.

## Submit Your Projects for the Transportation Resilience Improvement Plan (TRIP)

CMAP is soliciting transportation resilience projects to include in the Transportation Resilience Improvement Plan (TRIP) project The TRIP is intended to list. inform transportation planning and decision making. It will also position northeastern Illinois to better compete for federal investment opportunities, including the Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA) Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-Saving Transportation Discretionary Grant Program, which fund investments increased in transportation resilience to natural hazards.

To develop TRIP, CMAP assessed the climate risks to, and vulnerability of, the transportation Risk-based system. The Vulnerability Assessment found that flooding poses the biggest threat, impacting all transportation infrastructure, service operations, and users. Extreme heat and severe storms impact service operations and active transportation also posing а threat to users, rail infrastructure, electrical service, and backup power. The assessment data is available on CMAP's Data Hub and as a map to help identify projects, inform project selection, and incorporate into local planning activities.

## Communities Encouraged to Contribute to the Northeastern Illinois Development Database

From our partners at CMAP:

Our region is constantly changing, with some communities experiencing rapid growth, while others experience significant changes to land uses. Since 1987, the Northeastern Illinois Development Database (NDD) has tracked significant developments and redevelopments in the seven-county northeastern Illinois region.

Municipalities are to submit encouraged proposed, in-progress, or completed developments, as all phases contribute valuable data for the model. The NDD web map is an opportunity to ensure your community's growth is accurately represented in regional forecasts. The NDD web map is tailored for local government staff to actively participate in the forecasting process by submitting and editing developments. This data informs CMAP's local forecast model, which predicts household and job placements in developments across the region.
