FHWA Updates Pedestrian and Bicycle Funding Opportunities Table

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has updated its [Pedestrian and Bicycle Funding Opportunities Table](#), which highlights eligibility for pedestrian and bicycle activities and projects across USDOT surface transportation programs. The table provides notes and program requirements to help project sponsors identify funding administered through the FHWA, Federal Lands, Office of the Secretary, Federal Transit Administration and National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Shaping the Next Federal Transportation Bill

From our partners at the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP):

With the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act set to expire in September 2026, CMAP is working with regional partners, civic and labor organizations, and peer metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) across the country to outline shared principles for the next federal transportation reauthorization. Together, we've developed [One Regional Voice 2025](#), a statement of priorities calling for robust, durable revenues, enhanced safety, efficient transit and rail, maintained bridges, performance-based programming, multimodal freight, technological innovation, resilient systems, and policies that recognize the unique needs of major metropolitan areas.

Similarly, CMAP joined MPOs from other large U.S. regions to advance [common principles for reauthorization](#), including prioritizing safety, preserving core highway and transit programs, balancing formula and competitive funding, targeting investments to the nation's economic engines, and streamlining project delivery.

These efforts reflect a united call for a strong federal transportation package that ensures stable, predictable funding and empowers regions to meet the nation's evolving transportation needs

Park Ridge Opens Busse Highway Bike Lanes

The *City of Park Ridge* hosted a ribbon-cutting ceremony on September 27 to celebrate new bike lanes on Busse Highway - a key safety and mobility enhancement delivered through the Illinois Department of Transportation's (IDOT) Busse Highway Road Diet and Overlay Project. NWMC staff were in attendance for the ribbon cutting.

Implemented by IDOT in partnership with Park *Ridge*, the Busse Highway project reconfigured the corridor from an undivided four-lane roadway to a more efficient three-lane design. The new layout includes dedicated bike lanes, a center two-way left-turn lane, and select on-street parking, improving safety and comfort for all roadway users.

The corridor improvements span Busse Highway from Morris Street to Potter Road within Park Ridge, continuing from Potter Road to Miner Street in *Des Plaines*. The project creates a consistent cross-section and clearer operations along this important east-west link. Congratulations to Park Ridge and participating agencies.

IDOT Circular on Federal Government Shutdown Impacts on Transportation Funding

From our partners at IDOT:

[From Gia Biagi, Secretary of the Illinois Department of Transportation](#): "We have received inquiries regarding the lapse in federal appropriations and impacts to transportation funding and projects. Since the majority of federal transportation funds are authorized by the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act through September 30, 2026 and supported by the Highway Trust Fund, not the annual appropriations process, IDOT does not anticipate and has not been made aware of any impacts to funding or projects due to a shutdown. We will continue to monitor new developments and will provide additional guidance as warranted. We appreciate your partnership


