Both of the Technical Committees of the North Shore and Northwest Councils of Mayors met in August and voted to advance their respective recommended programs for a final vote by their full Councils of Mayors. The vote will take place during the NWMC Board meeting on Wednesday, September 9 at 7:00 p.m.

Pending approval, the FFY 2021-2025 Local Surface Transportation Programs of the North Shore and Northwest Councils of Mayors will be forwarded to the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning for inclusion in the region's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). He has served as Hoffman Estates Mayor since 2000 and is a former President of the Northwest Municipal Conference and co-chair of the NWMC Transportation and Legislative committees. RTA Recovery Scenario Planning Survey

The effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on regional transit have been profound, leading to reduced ridership, service changes, and declining revenues. In response to the crisis the Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) initiated a scenario planning and survey project to look 1-2 years into the future. The scenarios offered in the survey were discussed with key partners and stakeholders over the past few weeks and now the RTA wants to hear from you. IDOT Accepting Special Bridge Program Applications

On Wednesday, the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) issued a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for FY 2026 of the Illinois Special Bridge Program (ISBP) as part of the development of the FY 2022-2027 proposed Highway Improvement Program. To qualify, funding must be spent on existing structures eligible for Surface Transportation Program-Bridge funding, have a minimum total project cost of \$1 million and be within the jurisdiction of the local agency applying for the funding. Funding can only be used for construction and construction engineering phases of eligible projects. Applications for the ISBP are due to the appropriate District Local Roads office by Tuesday, October 6. The Boat Access Area Development (BAAD) Program is a state-financed grant program that provides funding assistance to local government agencies for acquisition and/or development of land for public boat and canoe access areas in Illinois. The program is managed in Illinois by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR). Applications for the program must be submitted to the IDNR by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 2. IDOT Publishes Township Bridge Program Allotments

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) published the list of counties receiving an allotment from the FY 2021 Township Bridge Program. The General Assembly authorized \$15 million to be used by the road districts for the construction of bridges.

Any unused FY 2021 TBP funds will lapse four years from the date IDOT published CL 2020-15 (August 31, 2024). Please submit your FY 2021 Township Bridge Program to your district office by September 30, 2020, or as directed by your district.
