NWMC Members Receive Funding In IDOT FY 2023-2028 Multi-Year Program

Governor JB Pritzker and the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) announced a \$34.6 billion program to improve roads, bridges, transit, rail, airports, and ports over the next six years. Over \$318 million will go toward highway reconstruction and preservation; bridge improvements; strategic expansion; engineering and land acquisition; and safety and system modernizations in NWMC communities, with additional funding for multi-modal projects in the region included as part of IDOT's Multimodal Multi-Year Improvement Program.

For the first time, road projects that add capacity will be evaluated by a new <u>Data-Driven</u> <u>Decisions Tool</u> intended to ensure greater equity and transparency in transportation planning and programming. Draft EV Infrastructure Deployment Plan Available for Public Comment

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) has submitted a draft <u>Illinois Electric Vehicle (EV)</u> <u>Infrastructure Deployment Plan</u> to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). The draft, pending FHWA approval by September 30, provides a framework for addressing many program components moving forward into implementation. IDOT is planning additional stakeholder engagement as the state moves toward implementation of the National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) program, both in the coming months and over the life of the program. In particular, IDOT will prioritize gathering public input in the following areas:

- Priority locations for charging infrastructure
- Identifying and quantifying benefits and challenges for disadvantaged communities
- Prioritization considerations for identifying locations, providers, and hosts.
- Program evaluation metrics and key performance indicators for the NEVI program
- Data collection
- Price transparency
- · Other areas raised by stakeholders

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Metra to Convert Six Locomotives to Battery-Powered

Recently, the Metra Board of Directors approved a <u>first-of-its-kind plan</u> to convert six of their oldest diesel locomotives to zeroemission battery power. The contract with Progress Rail calls for a base order of three locomotives with options for three more. The total cost for all six locomotive conversions is estimated to be \$34.6 million and will take about three and a half years. Metra plans to test the battery-powered locomotives on the Rock Island line. The battery-powered locomotives are expected to have a range of about 150 miles, be less noisy and have lower operating costs and lower maintenance costs than diesel locomotives.

CMAP Announces New Community Alliance for Regional Equity Program

The Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) is seeking community based organizations to apply for their new Community Alliance for Regional Equity Program. The initiative seeks to improve the investment process to better serve people traditionally excluded from transportation planning. The program will recruit up to 12 community based organizations and pay \$10,000 for one year of their time and expertise.

Applications are due by Monday, September 19. 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IDOT Issues Notice of Funding Opportunity for Special Bridge Program

IDOT has opened the application period for the Illinois Special Bridge Program. Projects must be existing bridges eligible for Surface Transportation Program funding that carry a highway and have a minimum total cost of \$1 million. Funding is limited to construction and construction engineering and requires a 20 percent local match. IDOT notes that it is beneficial to have received approval from the Bridge Condition Report (BCR) prior to applying to ensure the scope of work is eligible. Priority consideration will also be given to structurally deficient National Highway System (NHS) structures that will reduce the number that are reported to the Federal Highway Administration. Interested candidates should contact their district office by Tuesday, October 11 and applications are due by Friday, October 14. IDOT Now Allows Electronic Signatures on Select Forms

IDOT recently released a circular letter noting that some Bureau of Local Roads (BLR) forms will now allow electronic signatures. So far twenty-three (23) forms have been converted for electronic signatures with the goal of converting all forms to allow for electronic signatures.
