I. Call to Order/Introductions

Ms. Beckner called the meeting to order at 10:32 a.m. and Ms. Johnson read the names of those attending the video conference.

II. Approval of September 22, 2020 Meeting Minutes

Mr. Buehler moved approval of the September 22, 2020 meeting minutes. Mr. Baxa seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

III. Changes to the Surface Transportation Program – Shared Fund

Ms. Dobbs presented on changes made to the Surface Transportation Program – Shared Fund (STP-SF). The presentation provided background on the development of the STP-SF, discussed the expansion of eligible project types to include bike and pedestrian projects, reviewed changes to the scoring methodology and informed members of the upcoming call for projects in early 2021.

IV. Local Project/NWMC Multimodal Plan Updates

Mr. Knapp reported that the Village of Schaumburg has begun construction on Higgins Road at Plum Grove Road to fill a bike path gap within the Village.

Mr. Baxa reported that a Phase III agreement was made between the Village of Northbrook and Cook County to complete construction of their portion of the Skokie Valley Trail. He conveyed that the project remains on schedule with the anticipation of an early 2021 letting.

Ms. Schwab reported that the Village of Arlington Heights has received their permit from Cook County for the Buffalo Creek Trail project. She then reported that the electrical drawings for the traffic signals have yet to be approved by the county and the contractor has asked to delay start until the electrical items are approved and delivered.

Ms. Horn reported that the Village of Wilmette's Active Transportation plan is moving forward to the Village Board for approval and adoption.

Ms. Johnson reported that the Conference is developing GIS tools to track progress and implementation of the NWMC Multimodal Plan.

Ms. Hyink reported that the City of Evanston's Divvy program has grown to include 90 electric dockless bikes, which has expanded the program to new parts of the City. She then answered questions about the city ordinance regulating e-bikes and speed limits.


Mr. Hankey shared that this is his last meeting as a member of the committee as he is retiring from his position with Hoffman Estates.


VI. Next Meeting
