Mr. Brennan called the meeting to order at 8:33 a.m. and a roll call was taken for attendance.

#### Approval of Meeting Minutes – April 15, 2021

*Mr.* Brennan moved approval of the July 15, 2021 meeting minutes. *Mr.* Nagar seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

Mr. Andrews reported that Pace will begin hearings soon for their balanced 2022 budget, with two of these hearings being held virtually and two in person. The North Cook hearing will be held virtually on October 22. The budget will include \$15 million in new and restored service. He also announced that Pace will form new regional partnerships with transportation network companies to help address the problem of last mile gaps. He also reported that Pace will be continuing their capital program the biggest program in their history, which includes a I-55 express garage in Plainfield, and a new Joliet transit center which will be opening in the coming months.

Mr. Andrews said future improvements include a new operating division in Wheeling, expansion of operations division in Elgin, new ADA transfer facilities in Calumet City and Schaumburg, and enhancements to their ADA paratransit technology. He said there will also be an electric bus pilot program in Waukegan, with a plan to be all electric at that location by 2026. Mr. Tomich asked about the status of the Dempster Pulse project. Mr. Andrews's said that he believes that Pace is very close to getting permits from IDOT for the first group of stations. Mr. Brennan noted that Pace is moving toward electrifying its fleet and asked if, they will be coordinating with municipalities to install midpoint charging stations. Mr. Andrews said that they are definitely exploring it, however, they have not had any discussion with any municipality on the subject yet.

# g. Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways

Mr. Wright reported on the pavement preservation and rehabilitation program projects that were selected. He said that the Cook County Transit plan will start a more robust public outreach campaign in the fall. Mr. Wright also mentioned that shortly after the last Technical Committee meeting, the Invest in Cook program was approved. He said 39 projects across the county were selected with three of those projects located in the North Shore.

# IV. North Shore Council of Mayors Surface Transportation Program (STP)

## a. Local Surface Transportation Program (STP-L) Update

Mr. Czarnota presented an updated status sheet for the FFY 2021-2025 programs and highlighted changes in the letting dates.

# V. CRRSAA Funding Options

Mr. Czarnota reported two projects Skokie – Lake in Wilmette and Gross Point Rd in Skokie have been selected to receive Coronavirus Response and Relief supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) funding for these projects. He said this will free up funds to be used for the FY22 STP-L program. Mr. Nagar asked if CRRSAA funds could be allocated to projects in the construction phase. Ms. Dobbs responded that these funds are not available for projects in the CON phase.

*Mr.* Nagar moved approval of the CRRSAA funding options. *Mr.* Rietveld seconded the motion. A roll call vote was done with the motion passing unanimously.

#### VI. North Shore Council of Mayor Technical Committee Procedures

Mr. Czarnota provided an overview of the procedures that staff prepared following additional feedback from the committee. Mr. noted an error with the number of people needed for a quorum. The specific number of people needed for a quorum was scratched from the procedures leaving only a 2/3 majority requirement for the committee to conduct business.

*Mr.* Farmer moved approval of the committee procedures as amended. *Ms.* Webb seconded the motion. A roll call vote was done with the motion passing unanimously.

#### VII. Request for Special Meeting

Staff requested a special meeting on November 18, 8:30 A.M. to discuss how remaining FFY 2022 STP funds should be allocated. Mr. Czarnota that the deadline to submit cost increases to be considered at this meeting is October 10.

*Mr.* Tomich moved approval of the special meeting. *Mr.* Nagar seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

#### **Program Status Updates**

#### **CRRSAA** Program

On December 27, 2020, Title IV of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA) was enacted. This Act included a local government component that resulted in the allocation of \$42,647,247 to be programmed and managed by CMAP. In the fall of 2021, the STP Project Selection Committee and local councils of mayors selected <u>33 individual project phases</u> to be fully or partially funded with CRRSAA funding.

#### **Surface Transportation Program**

On October 13<sup>th</sup>, the CMAP Board and MPO Policy Committee approved the <u>FFY 2022-2026 Shared Fund</u> program. The STP Project Selection Committee (PSC) met on October 28, 2021, and approved the proposed <u>CRRSAA funding allocations</u> and discussed the <u>STP Shared Fund Methodology Discussion</u> <u>outline</u>, which lays out a tentative schedule for the committee to discuss changes to the STP Shared Fund methodology throughout 2022.

#### **Regional Safety Action Agenda**

CMAP is continuing its work to improve traffic safety and address the growing number of fatalities and injuries. Our Safety Resource Group met for the third time in October to discuss recommendations related to speed management through design, policy, education and enforcement. Topics included ways to improve design to support lower speeds, appropriate speed limits in urban environments, effective and equitable enforcement strategies and how to improve safety data for our region. The discussion points are being incorporated into the speed management paper which is in production. The Resource Group will next meet early this spring. Staff began work on a Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety position paper in early December. Three safety LTA projects kicked off in late November/early December in Calumet City, Bellwood and Riverdale to address multimodal traffic safety at intersections and along corridors. The Regional Speed Data project will begin this spring, which will analyze speed probe data to understand patterns of speeding and target countermeasures. An <u>update</u> on the group's work was presented at the July 16, 2021, CMAP Transportation Committee.

### **CMAP Products and Data**

#### Understanding the costs and benefits of tax incentives

Local governments often use tax incentives to encourage development and strengthen their communities. But before using these tools, they must ask whether tax incentives are the most effective way to achieve their community's goals.

The Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) has created <u>Are tax incentives the right tool for</u> <u>this development?</u>, a pamphlet to help local governments in northeastern Illinois assess the costs and benefits of three common incentive types: tax increment financing districts, sales tax rebates, and property tax abatements. This piece is a companion to <u>Improving local development incentives</u>, a technical guide published in 2020 that provides clear strategies and practices for more effective incentive use.

### **Community Data Snapshots**

In August, CMAP updated its <u>Community Data Snapshots</u> with <u>new data from the 2020 Census</u>. These data-rich snapshots — one for each of the region's 284 municipalities, 77 Chicago neighborhoods, and seven counties — summarize demographics, housing, employment, transportation habits, and other key details. They help local leaders and the public track progress and make informed decisions in their communities. The 2021 census data has been incorporated into the General Population Characteristics table, which includes information on total population, total households, average household size, and percent population change since 2010 and 2000. Raw data, including more detail, is available on the <u>Data Hub</u>.

#### **Making Transportation More Affordable**

The Chicago Transit Authority (CTA) has <u>discounted</u> all unlimited ride passes in an effort to encourage ridership, respond to changing rider habits, and make trips more affordable. The discounts, some of which were first piloted this summer, were made permanent in the CTA's 2022 <u>budget</u>. The transfer fee between trains and buses has also been eliminated. *All riders are eligible for the discounts*.

This aligns with CMAP's report <u>Improving equity in transportation fees, fines, and fares</u>, which recommends making transportation fares more affordable for households with low income specifically. The report highlights how affordable, reliable, and accessible transportation is especially critical for residents with low income, who tend to own fewer cars because of the high cost of owning and maintaining a vehicle. CMAP estimates that expanding reduced fares to all residents with low income would result in them taking 15 percent more transit trips.
