The Northwest Council of Mayors Technical Committee met on Friday, April 6, 2018 at Barrington Village Hall. The following persons were in attendance:

I. Call to Order President Darch called the meeting to order at 8:31 a.m.

II. Approval of Minutes

The minutes of the February 2, 2018 Technical Committee meeting were approved on a motion from Mr. Ottesen, seconded by Ms. Caddigan.

III. Agency Reports

a. CMAP

Ms. Dobbs provided updates on the CMAQ and STP regional expenditures. She discussed the latest developments in the STP Project Selection Committee's work on the development of policies for Active Program Management and the regional Shared Fund.

b. CMAP Council of Mayors Executive Committee

Ms. Dobbs reported that the committee will hold its next meeting on May 15 and its agenda will include an update on the STP Project Selection Committee work.

c. IDOT Highways

Mr. Walczak reported that Mr. Farmer could not attend, but his status sheets were attached.

d. IDOT Local Roads

Mr. Fierro updated the committee on the status of various projects, noting that there were no major changes since the last meeting.

e. Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways.

Mr. Beata announced that 70 applications had been received for the 2018 Invest In Cook call for projects. He also discussed his project updates, noting that Touhy Avenue underpass is well underway and expecting a July letting. Finally, he discussed the Cook County Freight Plan, which is due to be approved this summer.

f. Metra

Mr. Mack discussed upcoming but undetermined schedule changes due to Positive Train Control implementation, noting that all schedules will be revised. He also announced the recent Fare Study will go to the Metra Board in April.

Mayor Hayes asked about recent crowding on the UP-NW line. Mr. Mack responded it was due to less cars because of recent maintenance. President Darch discussed the recent ICC Rail Safety meeting she had attended and asked Mr. Mack about Metra's policy on allowing trespassers to board trains. Mr. Mack was unsure if there was an official position.

g. Pace

Mr. Walczak reported that Steve Andrews could not attend, but Pace handouts were available at the meeting.

IV. Surface Transportation Program (STP) Update

Mr. Walczak discussed latest council program, noting the projects that were moving back from FY 2018 to 2019. Mr. Ottesen asked for more details on schedules, including those with Right-of-Way. Mr. Norris requested clearer information on target letting dates and urged the committee to be more aggressive with projects on the B-list. Ms. Dobbs discussed staying aggressive with programming in case projects are delayed. Mr. Househ said he could arraign for Land Acquisition staff from IDOT to attend the next meeting.

The committee approved the revised program on a motion by Mr. Norris, seconded by President Hayes.

V. Cost Increase Policy

Mr. Walczak discussed the need for clarification on the council's cost increase policy under the revised STP rules. Increases had previously been capped, but a number of requests had come in since then. He discussed options including not allowing cost increases, going back to the original council policy, and amending the previous policy to allow smaller increases.

The committee discussed various options including funding increases at a 50/50 ratio or just funding increases for ROW and construction/CE, not Phase II engineering. Ms. Caddigan supported increases, but favored more information for each request. President Darch and Mr. Norris both agreed that large changes to the policy should wait.

The committee approved the allowing cost increases only for ROW Acquisition and Construction/CE phases on a motion by Mr. Ottesen, seconded by Ms. Caddigan.

VI. Surface Transportation Program (STP) Project Selection Committee Update

President Darch and Mr. Walczak summarized the last meeting of the Project Selection Committee (PSC). Mr. Walczak discussed proposed policies to sweep remaining council funds at the end of each year into the regional Shared Fund. President Darch asked whether the Shared Fund would be swept if there were funds remaining at the end of the year. Ms. Dobbs responded that there may be a contingency list of projects that could use extra funds, but they may go back to the councils if unused. They want to allow for flexibility. Mr. Walczak encouraged ongoing feedback from municipalities and discussed the regional councils' efforts to coordinate responses.

The committee voted to support allowing carryover of council funds as well as restricting the Shared Fund only to larger regional projects on a motion by Mr. Norris, seconded by Mr. Rummel.

VII. Northwest Council Methodology Update Discussion

Mr. Walczak discussed a memo summarizing the work of the Methodology Working Group, discussing eligible project types and phases, program management tools, increased safety scoring in the methodology, participation in state and county project, Technical committee membership and project scoring. Mr. Ottesen voiced concerns about scaling back participation in county and state projects. Ms. Caddigan supported the efforts the council had done to encourage participation of smaller members. Mr. Walczak recommended not implementing any changes until the PSC had finished its work with regional Active Program Management policies.

VIII. Other Business

There was no other business.

IX. Next Meeting

The committee agreed that the next meeting should be scheduled for Thursday, May 24 at 8:30 a.m. at the Barrington Village Hall.

X. Adjournment

The committee adjourned on a motion by President Hayes, seconded by Ms. Caddigan.

Metra Board approves fare pilot programs

Day pass, outer zone consolidation to be tested for a year

CHICAGO (May 10, 2018) – The Metra Board of Directors has agreed to test a new day pass, the consolidation of Metra's outer zones and the reassignment of certain stations to a closer zone as part of an effort to attract riders and simplify its fare structure. The ideas were among recommendations that emerged from a fare policy study that began in 2016.

The pilot programs will:

- Introduce "Round Trip Plus," a day pass for unlimited travel between any two zones, available only on the Ventra App, priced at twice the cost of a One-Way Ticket.
 - The pass will increase customer convenience, simplify fare payment, save time and encourage use of the Ventra App.
 - 75 percent of riders in a survey said they were likely or very likely to use such a product.
 - Pilot will begin with the introduction of a new Ventra App in late summer.
- Consolidate Zones K and M (there is no Zone L) into Zone J, thereby capping fares for trips that exceed 45 miles (about 1 percent of Metra riders come from those zones). This will consolidate four Zone K stations (Kenosha, Antioch, McHenry and Woodstock) and one Zone M station (Harvard) with five existing Zone J stations (Round Lake Beach, Lake Villa, Long Lake, Ingleside and Fox Lake).
 - Consolidating Zones J, K and M will cap the fares to stations in those zones and potentially mitigate ridership declines for trips that are currently the most expensive for riders from stations that have less service.
 - Pilot will begin in July.
 - About 110 additional round-trip riders per day will be needed to recover the estimated revenue impact of \$380,000.
- Reassign some stations to different zones to adjust perceived inconsistencies between lines where nearby stations are in different zones. Specifically, on the Metra Electric Blue Island Branch, move Ashland, Racine, West Pullman, Stewart Ridge and State Street from Zone D to C. On the Metra Electric mainline, move 83rd Street and 87th Street from Zone C to B. On the Rock Island Beverly Branch, move 123rd Street from Zone D to C.
 - Station reassignments will provide more similar fares for customers who board at Metra stations on different lines, but with similar distances to downtown, and may encourage more local use of these stations.
 - Pilot will begin in July.

• About 60 additional round-trip riders per day will be needed to recover the estimated revenue impact of \$120,000.

The pilot programs will be evaluated after a year to determine if they resulted in ridership gains and if the changes should remain in place. Other recommendations from the fare study, including off-peak pricing, are still being evaluated for possible future action.

The fare study effort started in the summer of 2016, when Metra hired California-based Four Nines Technologies to study Metra's fare structure, determine opportunities for changes and develop a model to help Metra evaluate the potential changes.

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About Metra

Metra is one of the largest and most complex commuter rail systems in North America, serving Cook, DuPage, Will, Lake, Kane and McHenry counties in northeastern Illinois. The agency provides service to and from downtown Chicago with 242 stations over 11 routes totaling nearly 500 route miles and approximately 1,200 miles of track. Metra operates nearly 700 trains and provides nearly 290,000 passenger trips each weekday.

Last Friday, IDOT had their April letting. The low bid for our project came in higher than the engineers estimate. Here are the details:

Engineer's estimate for	construction: \$3,507,000.00
Contractor's Low bid:	\$3,865,085.81

Approved Federal Participation for construction:\$2,737,600.00Approved Federal Participation for construction engineering:\$246,400.00

The village is requesting an increase in the Federal Share to the full 80% participation for both construction and construction engineering. I've attached the approved PPI for your reference.

If you are able to increase the federal share to 80%, the Federal Share for construction would be \$3,092,068.65; And for construction engineering, it would be \$282,341.60.

The total additional Federal funding the Village of Schaumburg is requesting is \$390,410.25.
