Mayor Craig called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

III. Agency Reports

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A. CMAP – Written report provided.

- **B.** Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways Mr. Joshi reminded everyone that Invest in Cook applications are still open until March 17. He also announced that they are undertaking a County-wide pavement and roadway management system. The County also partnered with the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning to create a Safe Travel for All Roadmap. Additionally, Mr. Joshi mentioned that a draft County-wide bike and transit plan has also been developed with plans to release the final plan later this year.
- **C. IDOT Highways** Mr. Farmer shared that his report is similar to the last meeting but was available for any questions.
- **D.** Illinois Tollway Ms. Passi reported that a daily construction alert is available on their website. She also announced tollway rate increases that started in January for commercial vehicles.
- E. Metra Mr. Mack announced that regional sales tax receipts through October had already surpassed 2022 budget projections by \$30.2 million. Operating revenue and expenses for 2022 are also significantly better than the budget so the amount of federal COVID relief funds that Metra has needed decreased by at least \$113 million, while reducing the 2025 budget deficit by \$15 million. However he said, they still face a funding deficit starting in 2026 and beyond when federal funds run out. Weekly ridership is within 44% of pre-pandemic riding levels annually. Mr. Mack then discussed Metra's newly approved strategic plan that aims to transition to a regional rail service model which has more frequent service throughout the day while still being able to support rush-hour traffic.

Mayor Craig announced that there will be an upcoming press conference on the merger of Canadian Pacific and Kansas City Southern.

- F. Pace Mr. Andrews reported that Pace had a new CTA and Pace shared pass and the reduction of cost for certain passes and transfers. He also announced that Pace will be hosting public hearings on the proposed adoption of van-pool fares.
- G. RTA Mr. Whitehead reported that the RTA adopted its strategic plan called "Transit is the Answer" at the February board meeting. He also mentioned that the RTA board approved community planning projects throughout the region where the RTA will provide local technical assistance. Additionally, the RTA has worked on securing discretionary grants including one for Metra aimed at improving accessibility at stations.

IV. CMAP Greenhouse Gas Inventory

Jared Patton, Senior Planner with the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP), presented information on work to support communities in climate action planning and to assist communities in these efforts, including the recently updated Greenhouse Gas Inventory.

Trustee Israel encouraged members to apply for funding from CMAP that will fund the creation of a local climate action plan.

V. Meeting with IDOT Central Office Staff

Staff announced that a meeting was scheduled for March 14 between NWMC members, other council of government staff, regional stakeholders, and IDOT Central office staff to discuss the agreements and permitting process and how to work to improve it.

VI. Other Business

Ms. Johnson announced that she would be leaving the Conference for a position with the RTA. The committee extended their thanks for all her work and wished her well in her new role.

VII. Next Meeting

Mayor Craig announced the next meeting of the NWMC Transportation Committee is scheduled for Thursday, March 23 at 8:30 a.m. at the NWMC offices and via video conference.

VIII. Adjourn

Trustee Benton moved to adjourn the meeting at 9:14 a.m. Trustee Israel seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

Plan of Action for Regional Transit (PART)

The development of a plan for a stronger and more financially secure transit system for Chicagoland is now underway. The outcome will be a set of state legislative recommendations that ensure the longterm financial viability of a comprehensive and coordinated regional public transportation system, as required by state law enacted last year.

To identify actionable solutions, CMAP is engaging a diverse group of stakeholders from the business, community, environmental, labor, and civic sectors, along with the public, in this process. The PART steering committee held its first meeting on January 18 and plans to convene four other times throughout 2023. The PART report also will leverage findings and input from the RTA and its <u>Transit is the Answer</u> strategic plan, as well as CMAP's <u>Mobility Recovery</u> project.

Program Status Updates

CRRSAA Program

On December 27, 2020, Title IV of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA) was enacted. This Act resulted in the allocation of \$42,647,247 to be programmed and managed by CMAP. In the fall of 2021, the STP Project Selection Committee and local councils of mayors selected <u>33 individual project phases</u> for CRRSAA funding. The <u>Regional CRRSAA Status Report</u> and <u>Regional CRRSAA Accounting Summary</u> were updated in February 2023.

Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) and Transportation Alternatives (TAP-L)

Safe Travel for All Roadmap (STAR)

CMAP's STAR program aims to improve the region's traffic safety environment. It will continue and build on the work of the Safety Action Agenda and align the effort with new federal funding opportunities including: the development of policy related to speed management, bicycle and pedestrian safety; the creation of safety action plans for qualifying local partners, the dedication of resources to planning and implementing complete streets projects and the creation of data resources for partners to better address safety.

Northeastern Illinois was awarded a \$5 million grant to improve traffic safety across the region. The joint application submitted by CMAP, IDOT, and the region's counties will fund a comprehensive, regional program called <u>Safe Travel for All Roadmap</u> (STAR), which will provide a framework for safety research and programs to make northeastern Illinois safer for all travelers.

CMAP Products and Data

Greenhouse Gas Emissions Inventory and Local Summaries

An updated <u>greenhouse gas emissions inventory</u> using 2019 data is available. This shows that between 2010 and 2019, overall greenhouse gas emissions in northeastern Illinois decreased by 9 percent. While this is progress, the region has a shared goal of reducing emissions by 5 percent annually through 2050,

and it fell 36 percent short of the goal. <u>Individualized data summaries</u> by county, community, and Chicago neighborhood that provide a snapshot of emissions from the building, transportation, and waste sectors are also available.

Improving Accessibility in the Region

CMAP has launched a program to help communities in northeastern Illinois improve accessibility for their residents and visitors with disabilities. IIJA booklet and resources for communities

CMAP has launched an <u>online resource</u> to provide communities and partners with the essential information they need to know about IIJA and its benefits to the region. This includes funding estimates for existing transportation programs as well as new programs that can make our regional transportation system stronger and more resilient for the next generation of users.

CMAP has also been working with partners and stakeholders to prioritize and achieve consensus around sustainable solutions to our region's transportation challenges. The highest priority projects for the region are reflected in the <u>IIJA booklet</u>. These projects align with the <u>core principles</u> that guide IIJA and our region — inclusive growth, resilience, and prioritized investment.

From Our Partners

Streamlined Environmental Survey Screening Process

On March 7, 2023 IDOT released <u>Circular Letter 2023-08</u>, which details significant improvements and changes made to streamline the process of environmental surveys to improve review time. Recent Bureau of Design and Environment (BDE) policy changes allow local projects to now be screened for natural and cultural resources by certain qualified and trained Central Office Bureau of Local Roads and Streets (CBLRS) Staff. The intent of the screening process is to also determine which projects must be submitted for more detailed surveys via the BDE Environmental Survey Request (ESR) process. For new projects which have not previously submitted an ESR and are not already within the BDE ESR queue, the new screening processes are effective on all submitted documents after **March 6, 2023**.

2023 Special Programs Assistance Conference

On March 13, 2023 IDOT released <u>Circular Letter 2023-09</u> announcing that the Special Programs Unit will be holding informational conferences in each IDOT district this spring to present three grant programs that could help fund your next transportation project – Economic Development Program (EDP), Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP), and Safe Routes to School Program (SRTS). IDOT staff will be available for two days in each IDOT District area to offer general information about each program and answer your specific questions one-on-one to help you take advantage of funding available from these programs. Links to register for the morning sessions and to reserve individual appointment slots are available on the ITEP and <u>SRTS</u> webpages.

Funding Opportunities

Invest in Cook

The Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways (DoTH) has announced a 7th round of Invest in Cook, an \$8.5 million grant program to help local governments and agency partners further their transportation projects by covering some of the cost of planning and feasibility studies, engineering, right-of-way acquisition and construction associated with transportation improvements. Applications are due by **5 p.m. on Friday, March 17, 2023**. Additional information can be found <u>here</u>.

Statewide Planning and Research Funds (SPR)

On February 24, 2023 IDOT issued <u>Circular Letter 2023-07</u> announcing the FY 2024 SPR Call for Projects. Funding must be used for planning and research activities, and all proposed projects should be related to studying or implementing a goal, strategy, or objective within the state's Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) or one of its associated plans, implementing performance-based program development, implementing asset management or benefiting a disadvantaged/economically distressed community. An informational <u>webinar</u> will be held on March 15 from 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. and applications are due before midnight on **March 30, 2023**. Program guidance can be found on the <u>IDOT website</u>.

4/14/2023

Pre-final plans due for projects targeting the **September** state letting.

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Illinois Tollway Update – March 2023

Tollway Board Chairman

In February, the Illinois Tollway welcomed Arnie Rivera as the new chair of the Illinois Tollway Board. Rivera, who currently serves as Chief Administrative and Equity Officer at Navy Pier, was appointed by Governor JB Pritzker, replacing Chair Dorothy Abreu who stepped down in January for personal reasons in order to prioritize her health and family. Rivera will continue in his role at Navy Pier while serving on the Tollway Board. Previously, he has worked at Chicago Public Schools as Chief Operating Officer and Chief Officer of Public Policy, among other roles. Rivera also served with After School Matters as a Senior Strategic Advisor. Rivera received a bachelor's degree in Economics and a master's degree in Education and Social Policy from Northwestern University.

I-PASS Assist Program

More income-eligible drivers are receiving the cost-saving benefits of I-PASS after signing up for I-PASS Assist Accounts that also offer few up-front costs. Working through a partnership with the Illinois Department of Revenue, the Tollway is able to verify the eligibility of households for I-PASS Assist using a secure web form that requires minimal information to determine if household incomes fall below the required threshold, which is based on 250 percent of Federal Poverty Guidelines. I-PASS Assist offers eligible drivers all the benefits of I-PASS, including the standard 50 percent discount on tolls, as well as additional benefits, including waiving the transponder deposit fee and allowing drivers to open an account with as little as \$4 in prepaid tolls. In addition, participants may have fees accrued from unpaid tolls dismissed—and avoid future fees for missed tolls. Go to https://www.illinoistollway.com/assist to access the application.

Metra to expand UP Northwest schedule on April 3 New schedule exceeds pre-pandemic service levels

CHICAGO (March 16, 2023) – Metra is revising its schedule on the UP Northwest Line (UP-NW) beginning Monday, April 3. The updated schedule adds 12 trains to the line's weekday service, exceeding pre-pandemic service levels.

"Metra has been monitoring ridership as well as customer feedback, and these schedule changes respond to ridership trends and increase capacity and convenience by expanding peak period as well as off-peak service," said Metra CEO/Executive Director Jim Derwinski. "And with a major multiyear rehab project scheduled to start on the Kennedy Expressway, this new schedule allows Metra to provide more commuters with a viable and much less stressful alternative to driving."

UP-NW riders are advised to review the new schedule at *metra.com/alternate-schedules* as departure and arrival times have been shifted on many trains to accommodate the additional service. Metra will monitor customer feedback and operating conditions and make additional schedule adjustments as needed to meet riders' needs.

The last major revisions to the UP-NW schedule occurred nearly a year ago as pandemic restrictions lifted and more people returned to the daily commute. The new schedule, launching April 3, will provide service at least every 30 minutes during the morning and evening rush hours as well as hourly service at most stations during off peak hours. The 12 additional weekday trips will increase the line's total to 78 trips compared to 66 today and 65 before the pandemic.

Outbound service in the early evening rush is expanded with three new trains departing Chicago between 3 p.m. and 5 p.m., including a 3:22 p.m. departure to McHenry that riders have requested. Arlington Heights riders will also have more express service in the morning and the evening rush hours with a new 7:25 a.m. inbound train and a 5:07 p.m. outbound train. The new schedule adds a reverse commute option for students at St. Viator High School in Arlington Heights, with a new 6:35 a.m. departure from Chicago.

Strategic plan implementation begins with funding advocacy

In the RTA's newly adopted <u>Transit is the Answer</u> strategic plan for the regional transit system, the top item on the advocacy agenda is securing increased funding for transit operations. The RTA projects the region will face a \$730 million operating shortfall starting in 2026 resulting from rising operating costs and pandemic-induced ridership losses for CTA, Metra, and Pace. The agency continues to educate stakeholders about the value of the transit system, its funding needs, and potential options for new revenue.

This work continued in March in meetings with state and federal officials. On March 2nd, RTA government affairs staff briefed representatives from eight Congressional offices on the RTA region's transit operating and capital funding needs. The briefing was hosted by the <u>Transportation for Illinois Coalition (TFIC)</u>. Later in the month RTA joined TFIC in a meeting with newly elected Congresswoman Nikki Budzinski about transportation funding. RTA is planning more educational meetings with members of Congress over the next several months.

At the state level, the RTA and all three Service Boards participated in a subject matter hearing on regional transit hosted by the Illinois Senate Transportation and Public Safety and Infrastructure Appropriations Committees. RTA and the Service Boards provided testimony, with RTA focusing on the fiscal cliff and budgetary challenges, and the Service Boards detailing how they've adapted to COVID and advanced ambitious capital programs to modernize the region's transit system. Testimony also included stakeholders from the business, labor, and advocacy communities.

Regionally, RTA executive staff recently presented to the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning's (CMAP) the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Policy Committee. Topics included our <u>2023 Agenda for Advocacy and Action</u>, as well as findings and projections as part of the 10-year financial plan for the regional transit system. As a requirement of <u>PA102 - 1028</u>, the CMAP MPO must adopt a set of policy and revenue recommendations for regional transit to be delivered to the Governor and the Illinois General Assembly by January 1, 2024.

Educational meetings about the system's funding needs with elected officials and other stakeholders inside and outside government will continue in the coming

New Case Studies Highlight Suburban Transit-Oriented Development Successes

This work was completed with funding and assistance from the RTA's <u>Community Planning program</u>.
